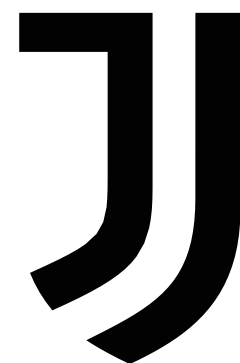

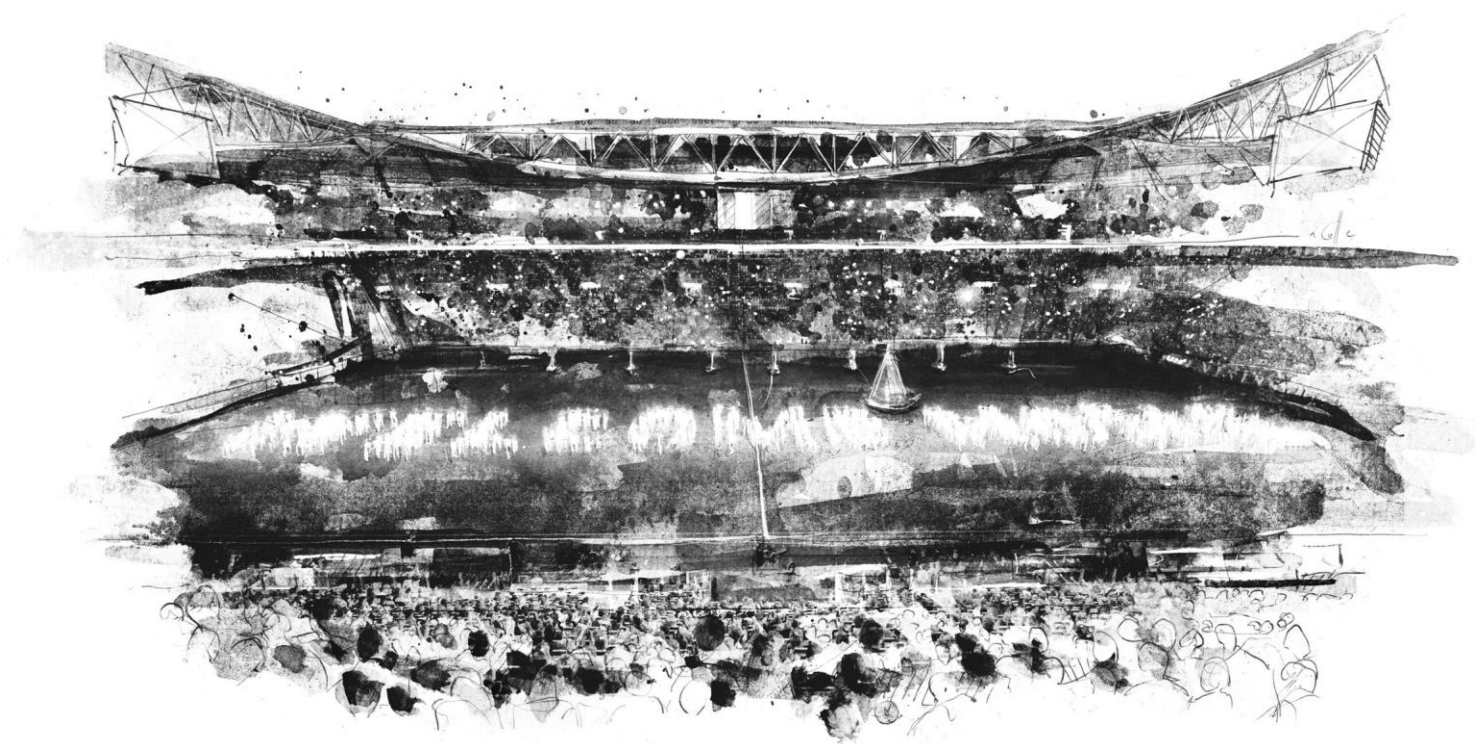

STADIUM DIRECTIONS AND ACCESS



ARRIVAL BY CAR:

Allianz Stadium is located on Corso Gaetano Scirea 50, Turin, easily accessible from the main roadways and highways by car or public transport.

From the freeway in both North and South directions, the recommended exit for Allianz Stadium is 'Venaria' Then follow the signs for 'Stadio Juventus'.



ARRIVAL BY TRAIN:

The main stations in Turin are Porta Nuova and Porta Susa. They are both connected to the city's Metro network. From Porta Nuova and Porta Susa stations take the metro towards Fermi; then take Shuttle bus 9 at the Bernini stop.



**ARRIVAL BY PUBLIC
TRANSPORT:**

The Allianz Stadium can be reached everyday on the following lines: 62, 72, 72bar and 75. On match days, the service is expanded with the Shuttle 9, leaving from the Bernini Metro station bus stop; the last departure is scheduled 45 minutes after the end of the match.



ARRIVAL BY AIRPLANE:

Sandro Pertini - Turin Caselle Airport is connected to Porta Nuova Railway Station by a shuttle service and to Porta Susa Railway Station by the railway network.
Milan Malpensa is also connected to Porta Susa Railway Station by a shuttle service.

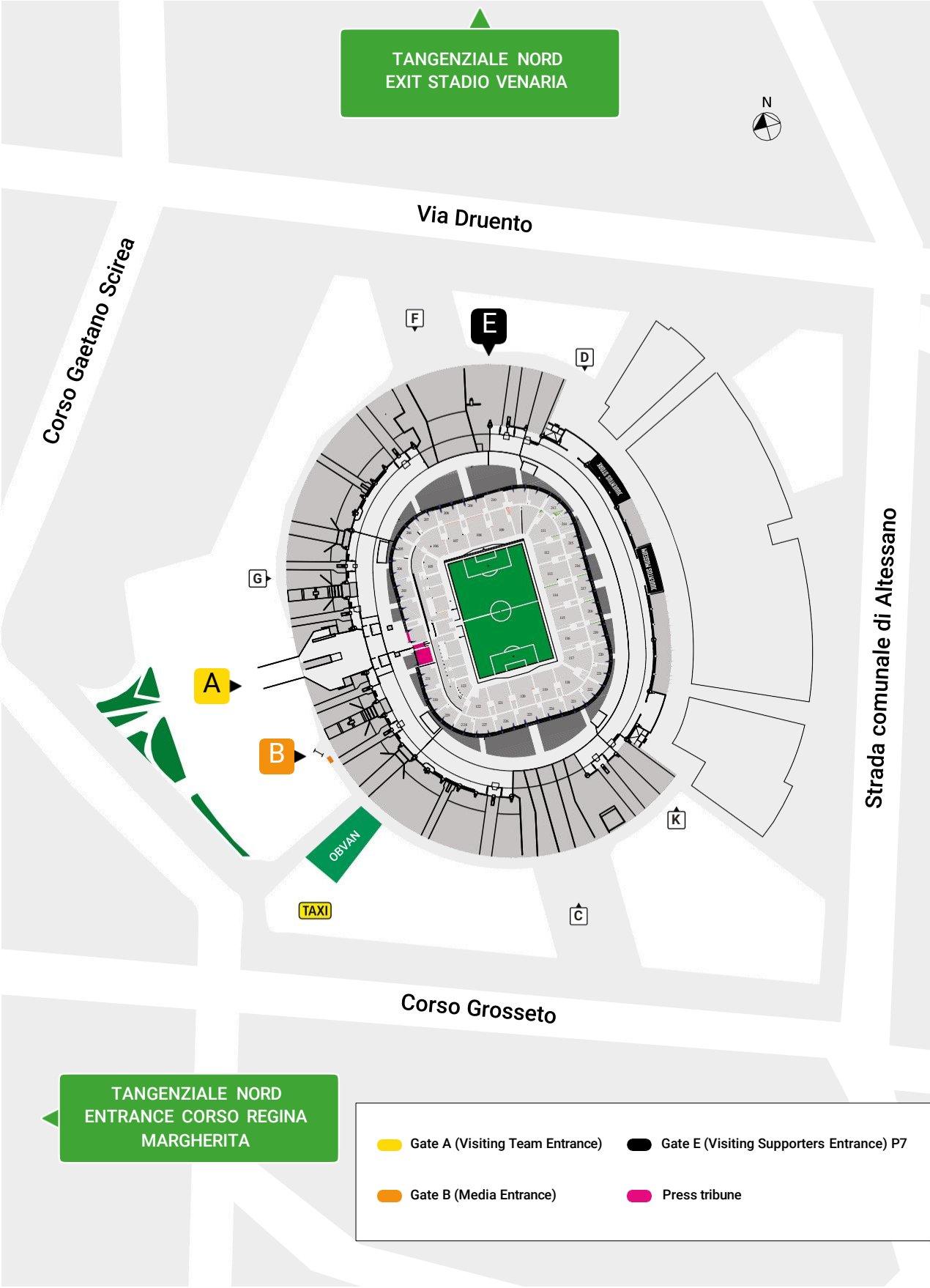

STADIUM RULES AND REGULATIONS

CODE OF CONDUCT

(Article 1f of Decree Law 28/2003 converted and amended by Law 88/2003)

For the purpose of these Rules of Conduct, the term 'club' refers to Juventus Football Club S.p.A. (hereinafter "Juventus"), while the term 'stadium' refers to all areas pertaining to the stadium, located in Turin and owned by Juventus, including the reserved external area.

Access to or presence within the stadium during football matches is governed by these stadium rules and regulations; by purchasing a valid ticket, the spectator accepts the rules and regulations set out by the stadium and accepts any rules and regulations issued by public safety and sports authorities, such as FIFA, UEFA and the Italian Football League. Failure to comply with the Stadium Rules and Regulations will result in immediate termination of the service contract and consequent expulsion of the offender

from the stadium facilities, as well as the application of a fine ranging from €100.00 to €500.00 issued by the Prefect of the competent Province.

If the offender has already been fined for the same offence, including at a different facility, during the ongoing football season, the fine may be increased by up to half the maximum amount and can also result in an entrance ban to sporting events.

Spectators must comply with the following rules, bans and warnings:

- 1. Season ticket or single ticket, whether printed or digital, uploaded onto the loyalty card, are assigned to an individual person and are non-transferable, except in the cases and in accordance with the terms set out in Italian law and by the organising club. Terms and conditions for ticket transfers can be found at www.juventus.com;
- 2. Entrance to the stadium is

only permitted with proof of identity in the form of an official document. An identity document is to be shown upon request to the stewards, in order to verify correspondence between the name on the ticket and the name on the document. If any discrepancy is found, or if the spectator cannot produce a valid ticket or loyalty card (where use is only permitted by the person named on the card), the spectator is required to leave the stadium immediately;

- 3. The ticket must be kept and exhibited upon request, until the end of the event and until departure from the stadium. Ticket holders shall comply with the club's procedures when leaving the stadium.
- 4. Spectators may only occupy the seat allocated to them by their ticket and must not move to another seat, even if vacant, without express permission from

the club.

- 5. Spectators may be subjected to security checks by stewards and by metal detectors in order to ensure that no illegal, prohibited or dangerous materials are brought into the stadium. Spectators are required to follow the instructions given by stewards. By purchasing a valid ticket to the stadium, ticket holders acknowledge the right of Juventus and its staff to search any individual and/or bag and case or any other items in their possession, without exception.
- 6. Disability entrances to the stadium are regulated by the club and access will be guaranteed until the full allocated seat capacity has been reached.
- 7. The club reserves the right to expel any individual from the stadium who fails to comply with any of the outlined Stadium Rules

and Regulations. Admission to future events will also be denied to anyone who has violated Stadium Rules and Regulations in the absence of a legal banning order.

PROHIBITED CONDUCT

The following conduct is strictly forbidden inside the stadium facilities and in the external reserved area:

- a. Discriminatory abuse, chanting, harassment or the showing of offensive written banners of a racial, homophobic or religious nature;
- b. Obstructing gangways, access ways, exits and entrances, stairways and similar such places without appropriate justification;
- c. Climbing on the stadium structure (including, purely by way of example, standing on the railings of the terraces);



- d. Damage to, tampering with or interfering with any structure, infrastructure, equipment, furniture, fitting or fixture within the stadium;

e. Bringing in or possessing poisons, harmful substances, flammable substances, paints or drugs;

f. Bringing in or selling alcoholic drinks with an alcohol content greater than 5°, unless a permit has been granted for certain areas, issued by the appropriate competent authorities, following approval by the police;

g. Bringing in, possessing or launching rockets, Bengal lights, fireworks, firecrackers and any other pyrotechnics or smoke bombs;

h. Bringing in, wearing or displaying shirts or other clothes that bear insulting or threatening words,
- incite or glorify violence, refer to people who have been convicted or charged or actively taken part in criminal or violent activity, bear symbols or names of fan firms whose banners and standards are not allowed within the stadium by the Gruppo Operativo Sicurezza (Operational Security Team, GOS), or bear symbols linked to extremist groups or movements;

i. Bringing in or possessing stones, knives, bottles, glass containers or objects, items which could offend or be thrown, noise emitters, laser pointers or any other objects which cause a disturbance or threaten the safety of anyone in the stadium. Drums and megaphones are the only noise-emitting instruments allowed. If they are brought in the same rules apply to them as set out for banners in point k.

j. Displaying any material which blocks other supporters' views,
- blocks the emergency signs or is in any way an obstacle to escape routes towards the pitch or the emergency exits;

k. Bringing in and selling within the stadium drinks contained in cans, glass or plastic bottles or other containers which can be closed. All drinks must be poured into a plastic or paper cup;

l. Bringing in, distributing or displaying dances, banners, signs, standards, scarves, documents, drawings, leaflets, printed or written material, drums and megaphones that are not explicitly authorised by Gruppo Operativo per la Sicurezza (GOS) as requested by the Sports Club, which interested parties may contact in advance to get hold of the relevant documents. These items, if authorised, still may not be displayed or used in locations other than those indicated by the sports club. At the end of the

- match, authorised materials must be taken away and, if specifically requested by the public safety authorities, including through the stadium's tannoy system, taken to the specific points of entry for inspection by the police;

m. Attempting to enter the stadium or be inside the stadium whilst drunk or under the influence of drugs or psychotropic substances;

n. Smoking in any area of the stadium, (except in the designated "smoking areas").

o. Bringing in animals of any kind;

p. Bringing in umbrellas, unless
- small and devoid of pointed parts;

q. Bringing in video cameras and reflex photo cameras;

r. Bringing in binoculars and telescopes;

s. Bringing in Drones (or other remotely controlled flying devices) of any size;

t. Carrying out any commercial activity inside the stadium and in the outside reserved area that has not been authorised in advance;

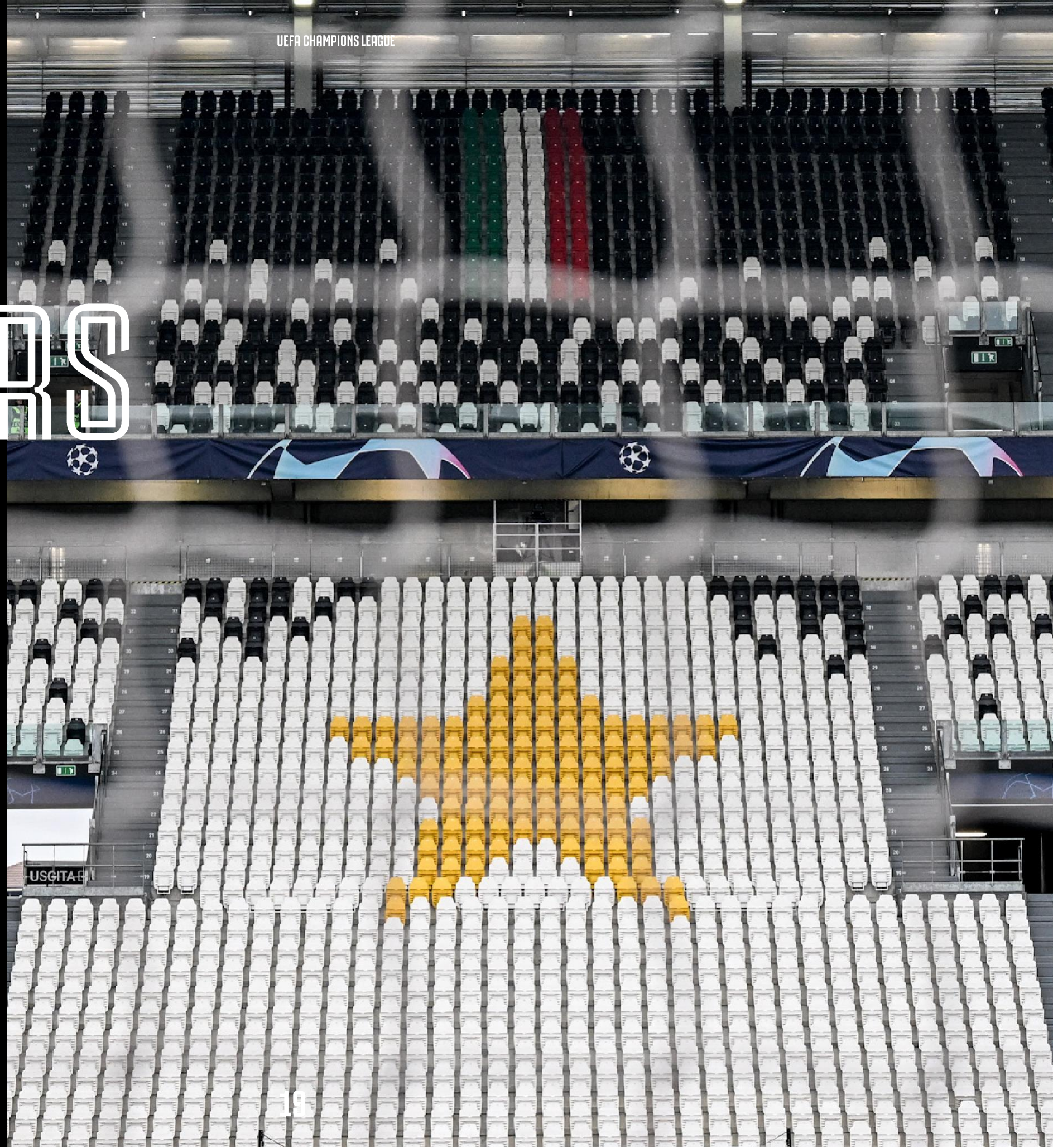
u. Behaving in a violent, threatening or otherwise aggressive manner to people in the stadium.



WARNINGS

It should be remembered that the following are offences and therefore banned within the stadium: misrepresentation; possession of any kind of weapon; showing banners with logos or symbols of associations that encourage discrimination or violence based on race, ethnicity, nationality or religion; encouraging violence during any competitive event; possessing, throwing or otherwise using dangerous materials or fireworks; climbing barriers; invading the pitch. Finally, it should be noted that the stadium is monitored inside and outside using an audio-visual recording system to which the police have access. The data collected is processed in accordance with the provisions of the applicable personal data protection and processing laws and Italian Ministerial Decree 06/06/2005. Personal data is processed in accordance with the law. The data controller is Juventus F.C. S.p.A.

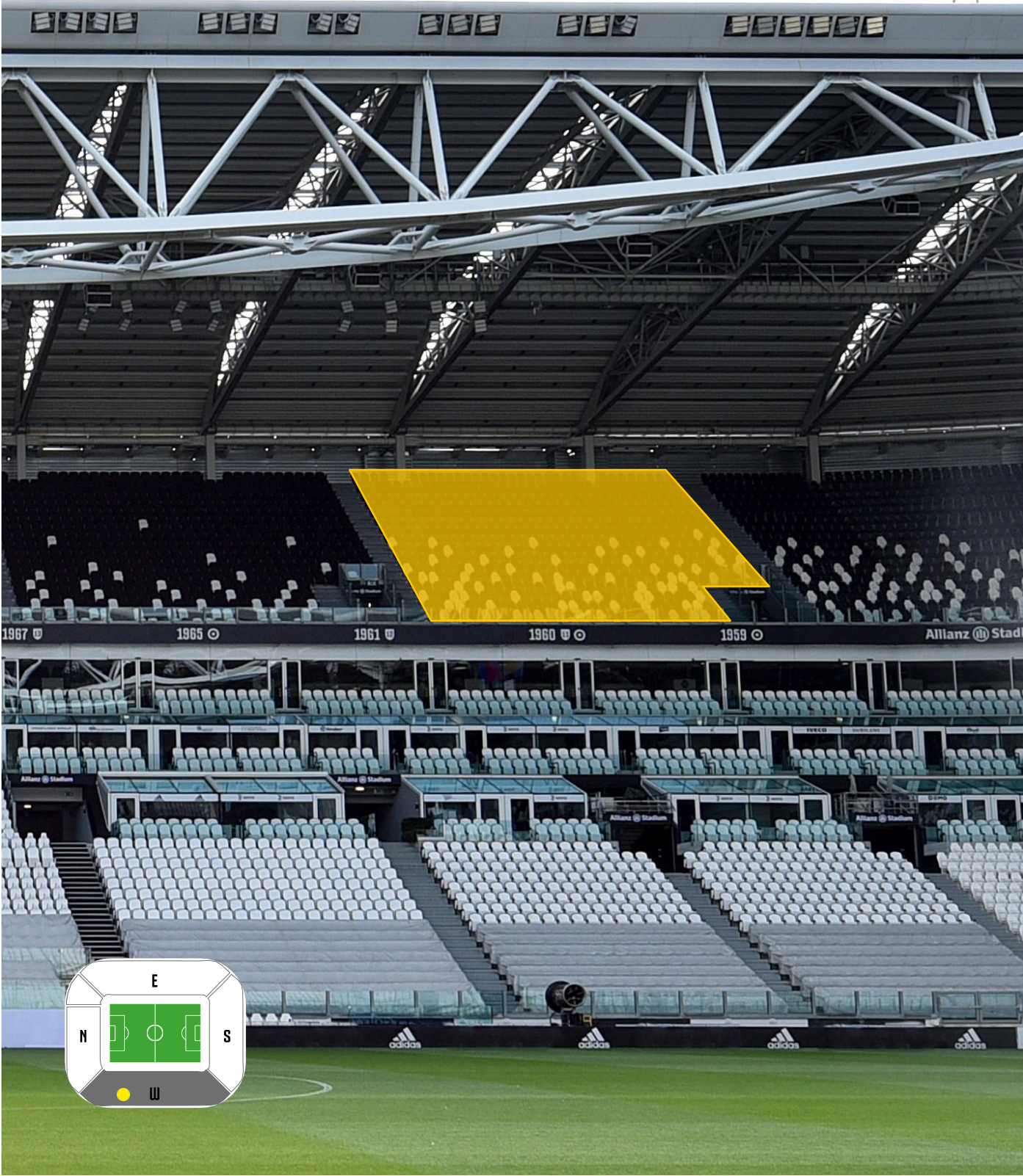

20 VIP TICKETS (SECTOR 101)

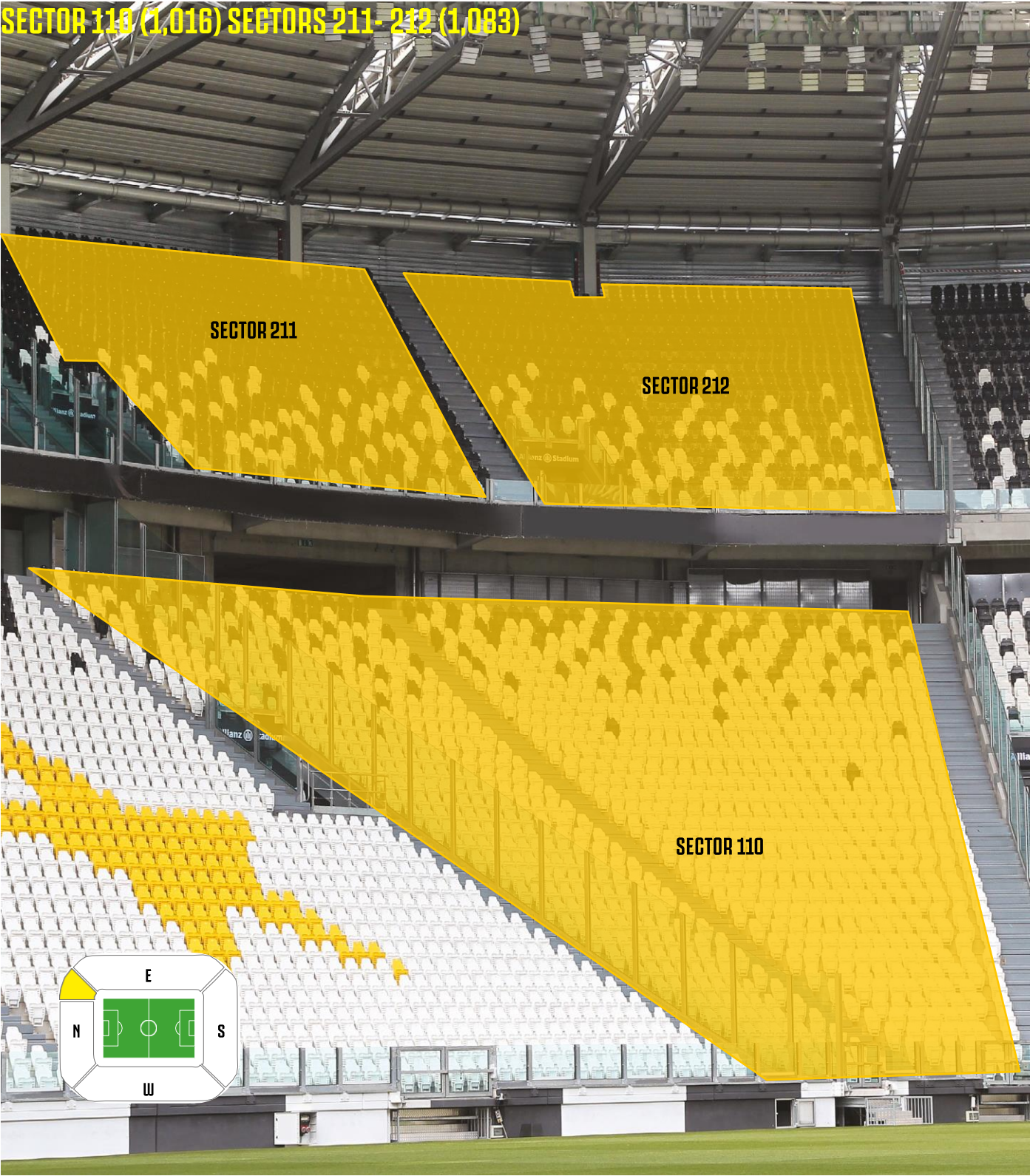


STANDS FOR VIP SUPPORTERS OF VISITING CLUB
(200 TICKETS, SECTOR 203)



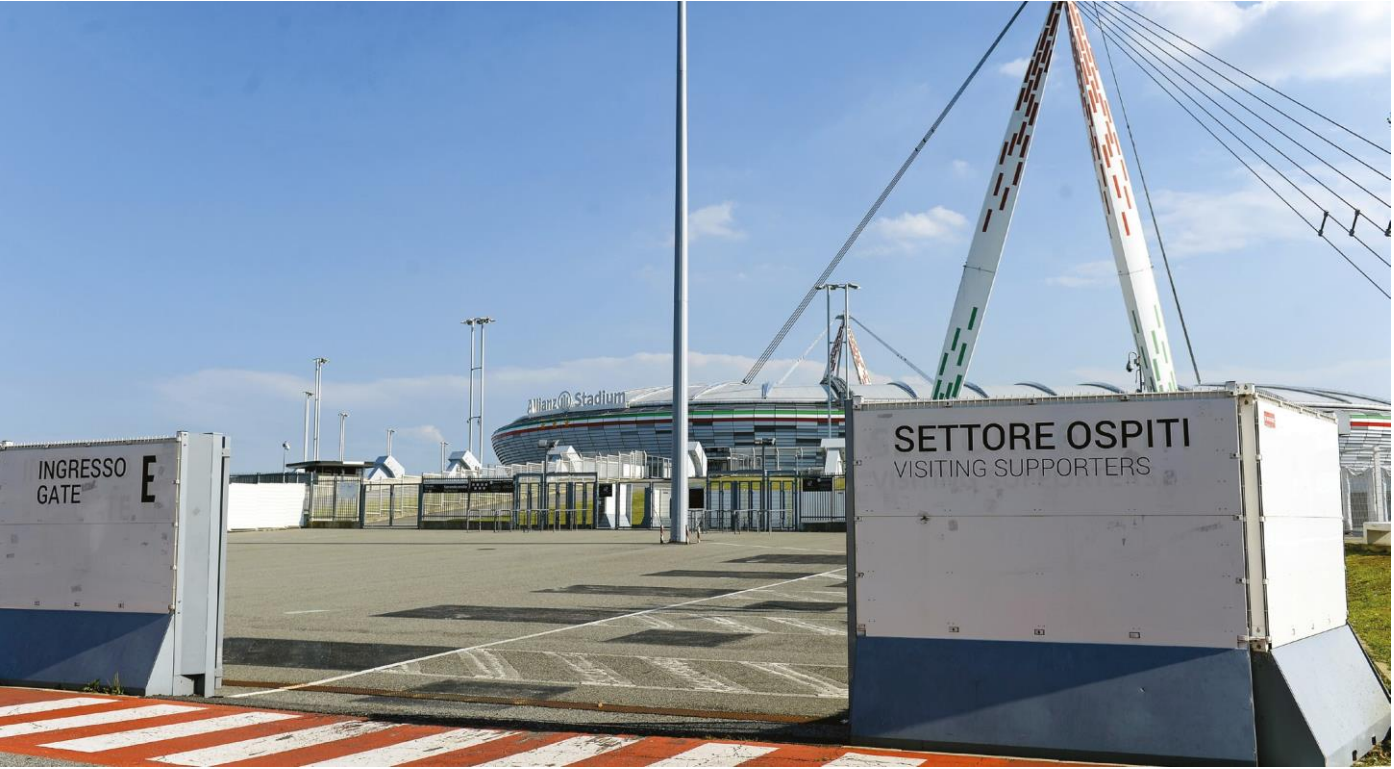
STANDS FOR VISITING SUPPORTERS - TOTAL CAPACITY 2,099:

The lower level is not connected to the upper one.
Therefore there is no possibility to move from sectors 211/212 to sector 110, even if the lower sector is not full.

GATE E AND EXCLUSIVE PARKING FOR VISITING SUPPORTERS



The parking can allocate a maximum number of 20 busses. Cars and minivans could be not allowed to enter for space reasons.

TICKET AND ID CHECK POINT - BODY SEARCH

Two separate accesses for first and second level



All supporters must present ticket and ID or Passport (no electronic documents admitted). Ticket reports personal data of the supporter, that must match with the

document and the person. Eventual problems of identity or match ticket/ID will be processed on site, asking the supporter to wait for detailed checks



All supporters will be searched by “pat down” procedure. Supporter could be requested to remove shoes in order to verify the possession of unauthorized items. Carpets will be positioned on the ground.

TICKET AND ID CHECK POINT - BODY SEARCH

Two separate accesses for first and second level



Accreditation box - Available for tickets distribution on matchday.

ENTRANCE TURNSTILES - FIRST AND SECOND LEVEL



Supporters may be requested to show ID card or Passport before introducing the ticket in the turnstile

CCTV cameras match the ticket data with the face and body of the supporter

REFRESHMENTS - LOWER AND UPPER LEVEL



Snack points are open before, during and after the match.

Cash and credit cards accepted. Beer up to 5% alcohol served.

BANNERS



The emergency gates facing the pitch must be kept free from banners for safety reasons. No flags or banner can be positioned on the side glass separation of the away fans sector. All banners, flags and coreographies must be sent to Juventus richiesta.striscioni@juventus.com at least 7 days before the match, for authorities check. One drum (at the first level) and one megaphones admitted. Pictures, size and material technical data will be required also for Fire Brigade approval.

HOLD BACK PROCEDURE

At the end of the match, away supporters will be asked to remain in the stands with free access to toilets. A second step will permit the fans to reach the snack point for food and drinks and the last step will allow the fans to reach the parking lot. The hold back period will depend on the traffic conditions outside the stadium and will be decided by the authorities.

CITY



TURIN

Originally founded in 28 B.C - during Roman times - under the name Augusta Taurinorum, modern-day Turin is one of Italy's main hubs for study, art, tourism, culture and science. The seat of government during the Duchy of Savoy, Turin was the first capital of Italy between 1861 and 1865. Stunning examples of architecture



both old and new live side by side in Turin, with baroque and Art Nouveau masterpieces rubbing shoulders with work by the famous architects who sparked the city's transformation in the 1990s, a process further accelerated as a result of the 2006 Winter Olympics, which played a key role in showing the world a more beautiful, modern and welcoming side to Turin. The capital of Piedmont and the nerve centre of the Italian automotive industry thanks to FIAT (now Stellantis), Turin is also an important centre of cinema, advertising, food, design and sport. The city has always had one eye on the future and over the years has established itself as one of Europe's leading contemporary art cities courtesy of a thriving network of public and private organisations, collections, foundations, museums, art galleries, events and initiatives. Turin has many art, history and science museums, four of which are of national importance: the National Cinema Museum, the National Automobile Museum, the National Mountain Museum and the National Museum



of the Italian Risorgimento. There are plenty of other well-respected museums besides these, including the Egyptian Museum of Turin, second only in importance to its counterpart in Cairo, the Museum of Oriental Art, the GAM - Modern and Contemporary Art Civic Gallery, Palazzo Reale and Palazzo Madama, which allow tourists to travel back in time to the Duchy of Savoy. Parco del Valentino is a particularly beautiful spot, running along the Po River, which is the longest river in Italy and cuts through the city from west to east. Also not to be missed is our Turin landmark the Mole Antonelliana, which houses the National Cinema Museum, the 16th-century Cattedrale di San Giovanni Battista and home of the Holy Shroud, the Galleria Sabauda and Palazzo Carignano, the former headquarters of the Italian Chamber of Deputies. Last but not least, on the city's outskirts, don't miss the Residences of the Royal House of Savoy, which hold UNESCO World Heritage Status and include the

Palazzina di Caccia di Stupinigi, the Aglié, Racconigi, Rivoli and Moncalieri castles, the Villa della Regina and - perhaps most importantly - Reggia di Venaria, sometimes referred to as "little Versailles". Turin is also attracting an increasingly large number of international sporting events and concerts, such as the Nitto ATP Finals and the Eurovision Song Contest 2022, as if to reiterate the multi-faceted spirit of the city. There is a thriving cultural scene too, with renowned events such as the Salone del Libro, Artissima, Luci d'Artista, il Salone del Gusto and the Turin Film Festival - one of the most important events in Europe. As if that wasn't enough, Turin also represents the very heart of the Piedmont food scene. It has always been a land of excellent chefs and real foodies, with the city having invented an array of stunning dishes that you simply have to try.

CITY CENTRE
MEETING POINT

A Meeting Point for away supporters may be organized by the Torino authorities (to be confirmed before the match).It is located on the edge of the Valentino Park, along the Corso Vittorio Emanuele II and not too far from the Porta Nuova Railway Station.The Meeting Point is operating since the morning of the match. Fan can park busses, minivans and cars.

In the afternoon (time to be defined) shuttles will be at disposal of fans for tranfer to the Allianz Stadium, escorted by police and free of charge.Shuttles will arrive straight to Gate E, inside or in front of the away fans entrance. The same shuttles will be available at the end of the match to return to the Meeting Point, escorted by police and free of charge.

JUVENTUS MUSEUM

Juventus Museum embodies the excellence of the Black and White tradition. It is a cutting-edge, hi-tech museum that was created both for the fans - to give them even more opportunities to relive Juve’s glorious traditions - and for the wider public, who can use the museum to look back on Italian history seen through the prism of the club. Having opened its doors for the first time on 16 May 2012, the museum reached the landmark of one million visitors just over six years later on 19 May 2018. Your visit begins with a look back through the team’s most iconic goals, the stadiums where Juve have played, memorable quotes by Bianconeri players and a collection of memorabilia. There is also a closer look at the current crop and the future of the club, as well as a tribute to Juventus fans around the world.

The Trophies Temple found a new location in October 2023 and is enriched with all-new technological special effects. A visit to Juventus Museum culminates in the “J Sport” area - a permanent exhibition dedicated to the professional athletes who have always been Juventus fans and the “The Team” area - dedicated to the current Juventus first team. In 2023 Juventus Museum has once again been placed among the top museums in Italy, placing 49th in the ranking of the most-visited museums in the country.

The museum visit includes the Stadium Tour and you will be able to access the most exclusive areas of Allianz Stadium. On match days, the tour goes to the next level: the Match Day Tour ticket gives you the chance to experience the exciting Allianz Stadium atmosphere as kick-off looms ever nearer.

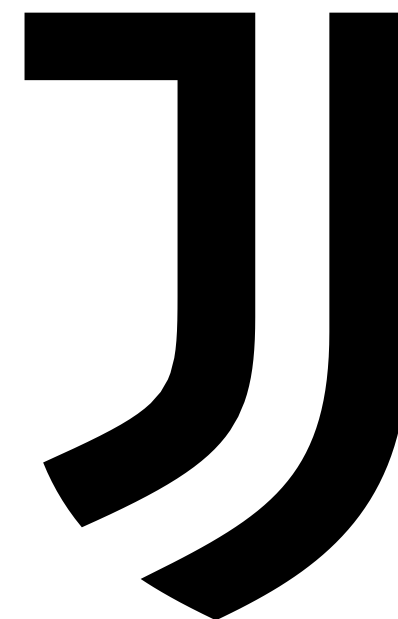
