Please plan your journey in advance and check for any travel updates on matchday.

Remember to have your match ticket ready.

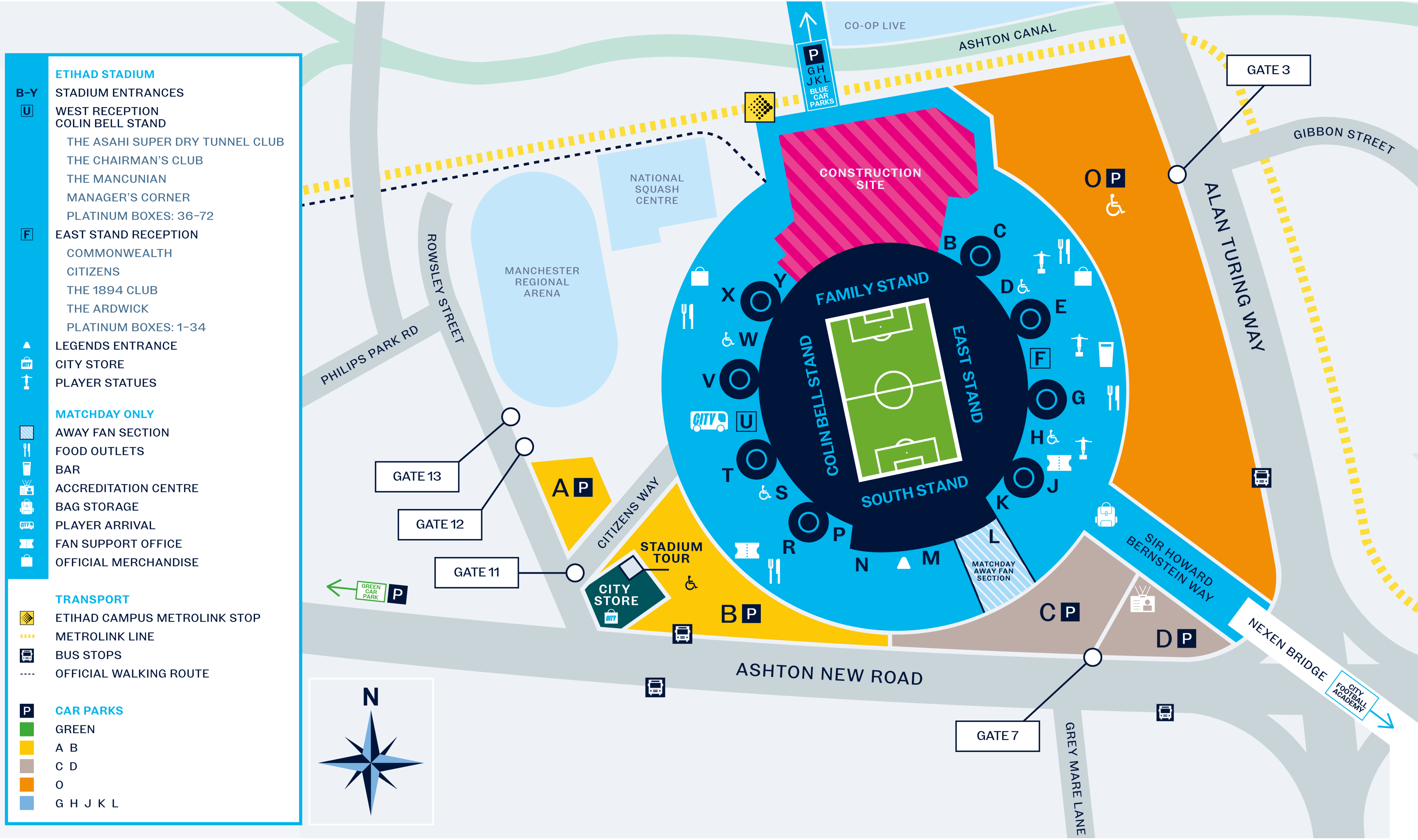
Bring along a form of contactless payment, as the stadium is cashless.

Leave bags at home, unless it meets the stadium guidelines.

We strongly encourage you to get to the stadium at least one hour before kick-off, so that you avoid the busiest public transport times and leave enough time to enter the stadium.

TROPHY DISPLAY

Don't miss your chance to get up close with the iconic UEFA Women's Euro trophy! It'll be on display on the South side of the stadium from 13:00 to 16:30.

This is a popular fan favourite, so we recommend arriving early to make sure you don't miss out. Just head over to Grey Car park, opposite the South Stand Ticket Office, and look for the display – you can't miss it!



TRAVELLING TO THE STADIUM

TRAIN and TRAM

The stadium is not accessible directly by train, but is well connected to Manchester's main train stations via tram and Manchester Piccadilly and Manchester Victoria stations are a 30-45 minute walk to the stadium.

If arriving at Manchester Victoria station, a shuttle bus service will be in operation to take spectators direct to the stadium and returning after the game. Tickets are priced at £4 for a return journey and you can pay on the day.

Etihad Campus has its own tram stop, connecting the site to areas across Greater Manchester. Journeys take around 10-15 minutes from the city centre to the stadium depending on your location.

TRAVELLING TO THE STADIUM

BUS

A shuttle bus service will be in operation between Manchester city centre (near Victoria) and the City of Manchester Stadium.

Getting to the game

-  Buses will operate from Stop NP on Corporation Street in Manchester city centre
-  Buses will depart every seven minutes from 15:00, with the last service departing at 16:59
-  Fans will be dropped off on Ashton New Road by the stadium

Returning to the city centre

-  Buses will operate from Ashton New Road (from bus stop on opposite side of road) for trips back to the city centre
-  Buses will operate on a load-and-go basis from approximately 18:30 until 20:00
-  Fans will alight the bus at Stop NP on Corporation Street

Tickets can only be purchased onboard the bus with both cash and contactless payments accepted:

Adult Single / Return - £2 / £4

Under 16 Single / Return - £1 / £2

ENCTS - Free

TRAVELLING TO THE STADIUM

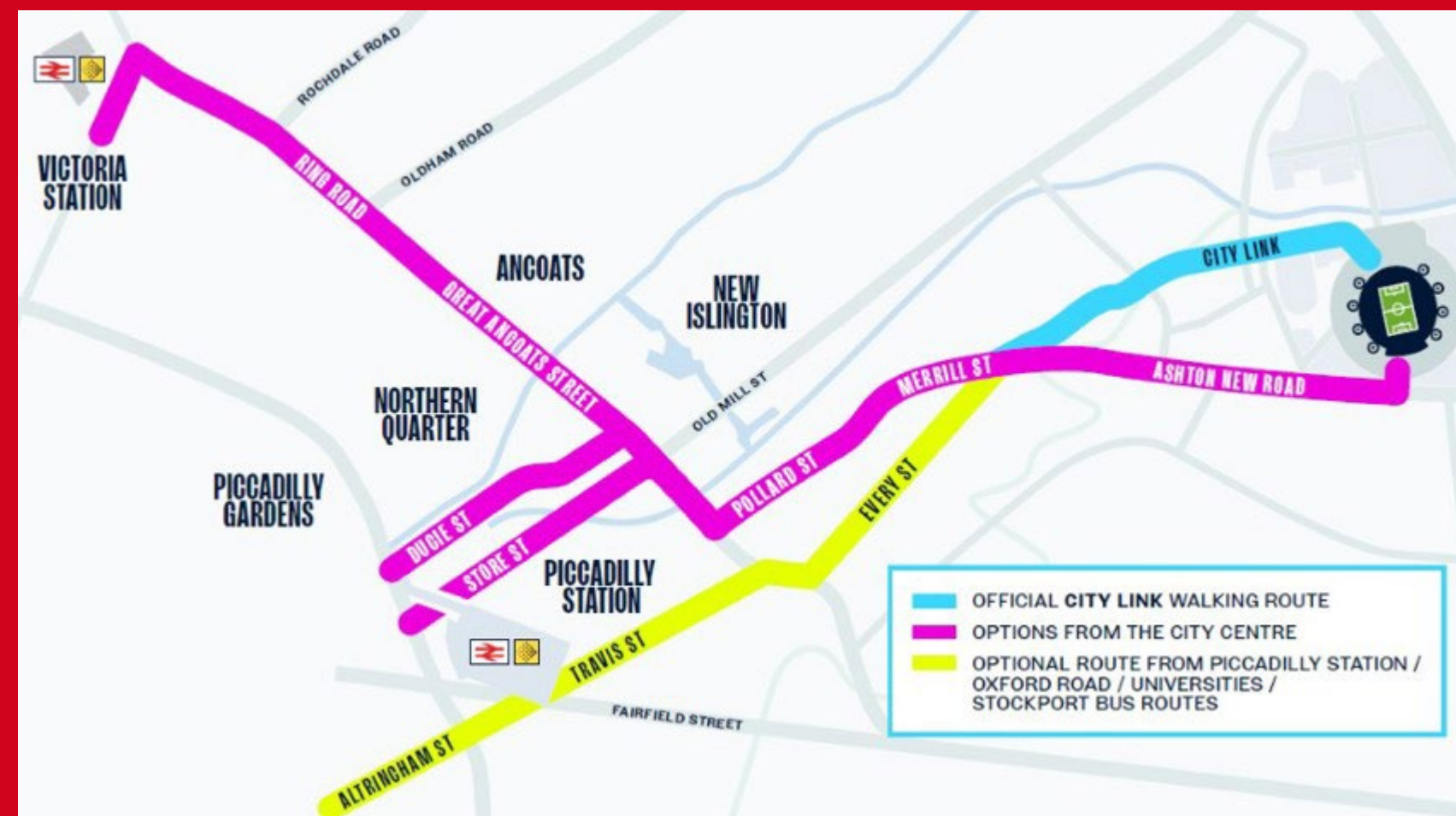
ON FOOT

Etihad Campus is walkable from Manchester city centre, and on average it takes around 35 minutes to get to the stadium.

The walking route is well-lit and signposted to ensure it's as easy as possible for fans to make their way to the ground.

Fans wishing to visit the popular area of Ancoats before the match for food and drink can walk to the ground in less than 30 minutes. Meanwhile, those who are shopping in Manchester Arndale can walk to the ground in less than 45 minutes.

The Citylink walking route connects Manchester Piccadilly Station to the Etihad Stadium, through the bustling areas of Ancoats, New Islington, and Holt Town.



TRAVELLING TO THE STADIUM

CAR

General and accessible parking is now sold out for this fixture.

There are thousands of car parking space available in Manchester city centre for fans. If you plan to drive, we encourage you to take a look at [Transport for Greater Manchester's city centre parking map](#).

Fans also have the option of parking at one of Metrolink's park-and-ride spots where they can benefit from free parking. There are over 20 park and ride spots across the network, but we recommend using one of the following that travel directly to the stadium:

-  Ashton Moss (Ashton Line) - 183 spaces and 12 disabled spaces. Under 25 minutes on a direct service from the stadium
-  Ashton West (Ashton Line) - 184 spaces and 11 disabled spaces. Under 30 minutes on a direct service from the stadium
-  Ladywell (Ashton-Eccles Line) - 332 spaces and 22 disabled spaces. Under 45 minutes on a direct service from the stadium

These two options are for anyone travelling from further afield:

-  Whitefield (Bury Line) - 331 spaces and 13 disabled spaces. Under 40 minutes from the stadium
-  Radcliffe (Bury Line) - 480 spaces and 22 disabled spaces. Under 45 minutes from the stadium

Accessible parking is fully allocated for this fixture.

The sensory room is fully allocated for this fixture.

AUDIO DESCRIPTIVE COMMENTARY SERVICE

Please contact your nearest steward on match day to request.

RESTRICTED BAG POLICY

We strongly advise supporters not to bring bags of any type into the stadium.

Small bags can be brought in but must be no larger than A4 (16.5 x 12 x 6.5 inches). There will be a bag drop facility located in Orange car park.

Arrive early to allow plenty of time to pass our security checks.



BANNERS AND FLAGS

FLAGS AND BANNER INFORMATION

All flags and banners must be smaller than 2m x 1m and not be offensive, discriminatory, or inflammatory in any way.

In addition, UK football's governing authorities have advised clubs that Israeli and Palestinian flags should be prohibited and, as such, they will not be allowed inside the Etihad Stadium.



GROUND REGULATIONS

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All supporters are reminded that they are subject to the terms and conditions of the Club's Ground Regulations, which can be found [online here](#).

Access to the stadium may be denied if you refuse to be searched by officials.

REPORTING ANTI-SOCIAL BEHAVIOUR

Supporters who witness abusive behaviour at the Etihad Stadium can report it by texting 0770015 1894. Feedback can be shared anonymously by texting the block, row, seat number and a short description of the incident to the number.

PITCH SAFETY POLICY

Any supporter, who attempts to invade the field of play, at any time, will be ejected from the stadium and may be arrested. This also applies to any supporters identified to be throwing items onto the field of play or into the home supporter areas.

SMOKING POLICY

The stadium campus, including the car park and concourses, are smoke-free, including electronic cigarettes.

SAFEGUARDING

The FA & Manchester City Football Club is committed to safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children and adults at risk of harm. All staff are required to abide by the Club's Safeguarding Policy at all times.

All visitors including children and adults at risk will be protected by and be expected to follow the Club's Safeguarding Policy whilst at any of the Club's sites.

While safeguarding is everyone's responsibility, the Club has a dedicated Safeguarding Team in place who can provide advice and who hold responsibility for leading the response to safeguarding concerns.

FAQ'S

"Can I bring a child to a match?"

Please make sure that you give each child in your care their ticket and that they keep this throughout their visit to help with relocating a child if they become separated.

Children under the age of 14 need to be accompanied by an adult.

"Can I pay for food and drink items inside the Stadium with cash?"

No, like most modern arenas, the stadium is cashless.



FAQ'S

"Can I bring a musical instrument into the Stadium?"

Whilst The FA have been given special permission for the England Band to be in attendance for the fixture, fans are not allowed to bring musical instruments into the stadium.

"Can I smoke at the Stadium?"

There is no smoking or use of e-cigarettes permitted anywhere across the stadium campus.
