SUPPORTER LIAISON

This number can be dialled to reach emergency services - **medical**, **fire and police** - from anywhere in Europe. It can be called from any telephone (landline, pay phone or mobile)

and calls are free.

IF YOU ARE ARRESTED

You can contact the British Consulate and request consular assistance if you are arrested, however they cannot get you out of prison, represent you in court or pay your bills. Please ensure you keep the Supporter Liaison Officer updated at any time you speak to the British Consulate or have to make use of any of the emergency number. Madrid Police have advised that if you are arrested you will not be permitted entry/re-entry to the stadium.

MINIMISE THE RISK

- Consider the impact of wearing Club colours when not inside the stadium
- It is mandatory to carry Photo identification. Police conduct checks and want to see originals.
- Carry your EHIC card and ensure you check with your insurance company whether they will cover any medical treatment for the respective country.
- Carry a note of the address of your hotel (in both English and the local language), it can help people give you
 directions and ensure that taxi drivers know where you want to go.
- Keep the number of valuables you carry to a minimum passport, a credit card, your phone and some money
- Keep valuables/cash out of sight, especially in crowded areas, tourist spots, and public transport, where pickpockets and bag snatchers operate. Only carry what you need, leave spare cash and valuables in hotel safety deposits.
- Change money at a bank, hotel, or in exchange kiosks NOT on the street
- Carry the contact number for your travel insurer at all times.
- Carry the address and telephone number of the British Consulate so you can call for help.
- Leave a photocopy of your passport and other documents safe in your hotel in case you lose the originals.
- Do not carry weapons of any sort, you may get you arrested.
- Don't commit acts of theft: you are more likely to be locked up rather than fined or deported.
- Be alert to the possibility of street crime and petty theft as foreigners may appear to be lucrative targets.
 Where possible, avoid walking alone late at night in dark or poorly lit streets.
- Do not leave drinks or food unattended as they could be spiked. Beware of accepting drinks from casual acquaintances.
- Do not drink in the streets, you can be arrested for doing so.
- Do not leave bags unattended at any time.

SANTIAGO BERNABÉU STADIUM

The address for the Santiago Bernabéu Stadium is Avenida de Concha Espina, 1, 28036 Madrid.

The stadium is located in a built-up business area of central Madrid, approximately 5km north of two of the city's main squares – the Plaza Mayor and the Puerta del Sol.

It is a partially covered, bowl-shaped stadium with five tiers of seating. This iconic venue has hosted several UEFA finals, the last one being the UEFA Champions League Final in 2010. The underground (Metro) is the fastest, most efficient and most affordable way to move around Madrid.

GETTING TO THE STADIUM

Estadio Santiago Bernabéu is located in central Madrid on the Paseo de la Castellana, one of Madrid's main streets. The stadium lies about 4 kilometres north of the Plaza de Cibeles, where the Paseo de la Castellana starts. It is a similar distance from Puerta del Sol, one of Madrid's main squares.

The underground (Metro) is the fastest, most efficient and most affordable way to move around in Madrid. The city has a vast metropolitan network, one of the most comprehensive in Europe, and covers almost all the points in the capital and many of the neighbouring cities. The Santiago Bernabéu station services the stadium and stops approximately 100 metres away.

Metro: Line 8 (Nuevos Ministerios) connects the airport directly with the city centre and its main squares in under 15-minutes.

Bus numbers 101 run from Canillejas, and numbers 200 and 204 from Avenida de América.

Taxis in Madrid are white with a diagonal red band on their front door bearing the emblem of the city. They have a green light that is on when they are free. To hail a taxi all you need to do is raise your hand. The average time from the airport to the centre of Madrid by taxi is around 20 minutes.

MEETING POINT

Near to the stadium and approximately a 10-minute walk, the local police have advised that the bars and restaurants at **Avenida de Brasil** welcome visiting supporters.

AT SANTIAGO BERNABÉU STADIUM

Match Tickets:

Only supporters with a valid match ticket, with the name of the supporter written on with corresponding photo ID will be admitted. Those with damaged or forged tickets/ID, or people who have lost or had their ticket/ID stolen will not be allowed access. Entry in to the stadium can be slow. There will be ticket checks and searches at the entrance to the turnstiles.

Tickets are not transferable and cannot be used by any other supporter. Duplicate tickets will not be issued. Take care of your match ticket at all times.

Please sit in the seat allocated to you and detailed on your ticket.

Areas to avoid:

Some of the streets around the stadium are closed on a matchday. The Calle de Rafael Salgado, behind the North Stand, will be closed and used to park the supporter coaches, which is very close to the entrance into the stadium.

It is strongly advised that MCFC fans should avoid the streets on the south side of the Santiago Bernabéu Stadium, as they are used by the Real Madrid supporters. There are bars, pubs, restaurants and cafes close to the stadium. Drinking on the streets is not allowed under Spanish law and will be monitored by local police.

Stadium Access:

Manchester City supporters are seated in Blocks 523-533 and Blocks 621-633. These seats are located in the top two tiers of the North Stand (Fondo Norte).

Supporters will access from Tower D at the North East end of the stadium on the corner of Salgado and Damian (street). As well as a standard spiral ramp entry, the tower also houses stairs and an internal escalator system.

The stadium opens at approximately 7:30pm, you are advised to arrive at least 60-miniutes prior to kick off as security checks can take up to an hour to complete before admittance to the away end. All supporters must be inside the stadium no later than 30-minutes before kick-off (8:30pm local time).

Real Madrid have advised that all supporters will be required to remove their footwear for checking at the entry point to the lanes.

Metal barriers will be in place to guide supporters towards the ground floor entrance into Tower D. Police Officers will line the mouth of the barrier area and conduct a first ticket check. At the entrance into the tower, security staff will conduct a second ticket check and supporters may also be subject to further searches, including the use of electronic wands. Please be patient with the Real Madrid stewards and respect the job they have to do. Supporters will then walk up the slope to another set of eight steps, at the top of which are waist high electronic turnstiles where the match ticket is presented.

Please note there is construction work underway at the stadium, and whilst it is not expected to impact ingress or egress, please follow any instructions given by the stewards or local police.

Having passed through the turnstiles, supporters will continue to walk up the tower to reach the seats. The seating areas are very steep, so please take care.

Real Madrid and the Spanish Police have stated that supporters will not be allowed in the stadium if:

- You do not have a valid match ticket and photo ID
- You have been prohibited from attending sports events in the past
- You are visibly drunk or under the effect of narcotics
- You are found to be carrying prohibited items

Any City supporters in the home areas of the Santiago Bernabéu Stadium face ejection for inappropriate behaviour and this may result in further sanctions being taken by Manchester City Football Club. CCTV is installed across the whole of the stadium.

Match Programme: There will be no match programme produced for this fixture.

Food & Drink: Available from concession stands on the day; both cash (Euros) and card payments are

accepted. Alcohol is not served inside the stadium.

Toilets: Both male and female facilities are available on both levels.

Access Information: The Santiago Bernabéu Stadium has elevators and escalators that provide easy access,

especially for those who are less mobile, to several sections of the stands The wheelchair platform is located in Block 227 of the East Stand, entrance to the stadium via Gate 51

adjacent to Tower D. Access is from approx. 7:30pm (local time).

Category One: Located in Block 107 of the West Stand. Supporters located in these seats will access the

stadium via gate 15 adjacent to Tower C. Access is from 7:15pm (local time).

Acceptable items: Flags and banners (excluding sticks/poles) 2m x 1m subject to language & content checks

Small bags no bigger than A4; content will checked upon entry

Prohibited items: NO PYROTECHNICS, SMOKE BOMBS OR FLARES

No lighters or electronic cigarettes - it is a no smoking stadium

No megaphones and drums

No mobile phone chargers and/or charging packs

Professional audio or visual recording equipment

No bottles or cans. Alcohol is banned within the stadium: it is an offence to be under the

influence of drink and drugs when you enter the stadium.

Possession and use of recreational drugs is illegal and any infringement may result in

arrest and imprisonment

Discretion lies with the Real Madrid stewards and local police as to who is deemed a safety risk, so please drink sensibly or you may face the possibility of not being allowed

to enter the stadium.

Luggage: There is no area to leave luggage so please make alternative arrangements at your hotel

or leave on your coach as it will not be permitted into the stadium.

Respect the Badge:

We recognise that most supporters want to watch a football match and not to listen to abusive or indecent language from the stands. Discriminatory behaviour which includes, shouting, chanting or actions such as racist, sectarian, homophobic, sexist or anti-disability behaviour is unacceptable.

If you witness incidents like these please get in contact with a steward as soon as you can and report your concerns, this will help us to act on them as quickly as possible. You can also alert the Supporter Liaison Officer by email slo@mcfc.co.uk or by mobile, +44 (0)7827 997817.

The use of pyrotechnics, flares and smoke bombs is also prohibited and anyone found in possession of or being associated to these items faces arrest.

Kick it Out:

The local police have advised that all supporters arrive at the stadium from 7pm (local time), as the security checks at the entrance may take some time. Anyone not in the stadium by 8:15pm (local time) may be delayed in entering the stadium in time for kick-off.

POST-MATCH

We have been advised there will be a hold back of approx. 20-30minutes, but this is subject to change. We ask that you remain patient at all times, respect the stewards and work with the Club at this time.

We have included a Santiago Bernabéu Stadium map which will assist with locating all the entrances on the day. You can also visit the <u>Real Madrid website</u> for further information on the Club.
